Dr. Karen Wright, current Director of Neuro-Oncology Experimental Therapeutics at the Dana-Farber /Boston Children's Cancer and Blood Disorders Center and an Assistant Professor of Pediatrics at the Harvard Medical School. She attended medical school at Temple University School of Medicine before completing pediatric residency at Dartmouth. Her fellowship training was focused in hematology, oncology and neuro-oncology at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital where she stayed on as faculty for an additional 6 years. Dr. Wright transitioned to her current post in Boston about 5 years ago. Her clinical training paired with prior research led to her interest in translational research as it relates to early phase novel trial design focused on target validation, pharmacokinetics and pharmacodynamics while also fostering her interest in identifying detection methods for surveillance, resistance and recurrence.
